RECENT ACTIVITIES:

Create local leadership circles – grassroots faith leaders working together around key social issues like housing & immigration.

Walk with Immigrant, Refugee, and Interfaith communities

- Received the 2018 Outstanding Community Partner Award from the Northwest Immigrant Rights Project for our network of congregations' "*profound impact on the experience of asylum seekers released from federal detention*".
- Trainings offered and leadership circles formed to prepare congregations & individuals to walk with our neighbors – in matters of personal hospitality & justice advocacy.
- 35 people released from detention (mainly parents separated from their children in the humanitarian crisis of June of 2018) were offered short term housing hospitality and airport accompaniment. Each individual released required about 12 volunteers & communities to support them. We trained, scheduled, and coordinated the effort.

Protect and Expand Affordable Housing

- King County: \$1.65B secured for housing, thanks in part to passionate influence from congregations across the county, coordinated to bring the faith voice to the conversation.
- Bellevue: in an historic vote, Bellevue's City Council passed an ordinance that for the first time allows for the siting of permanent shelters on and in Bellevue. This was possible through the tireless witness and advocacy of 20 Eastside congregations united through a Church Council organizer.
- Burien: When an apartment complex primarily inhabited by low-income families received 20-day eviction notices, our local Ecumenical Leadership Circle quickly worked with Burien's City Council to support emergency relocation costs for the tenants, raising \$12,000 from congregations and an additional \$35,000 from the City government

JUST THE NUMBERS

During 2018, 8,000 people and 400 organizations joined into 125 events & 15 campaigns.
